Bishop Toal's Easter Message 2020.

As Christians celebrate Easter this year, we are thinking of the suffering inflicted upon us by the Covid-10 Virus. It is a dreadful time for the whole world and our thoughts are with all who have caught the virus and their loved ones. We are grateful for the dedication and courage of those caring for the sick and the vulnerable, and all who are providing the essential services we all rely on. It is hard to find hope, but our celebration of Easter encourages us to have such a hope - a hope that we will recover and that life will be better again. For Christians we find our hope in Jesus Christ, who having suffered a terrible death on the cross rose again to new life and promised us a share in eternal life. In such a time of crisis we cling on to this faith and reach out to Our Lord in our need. Although we have not been able this year to celebrate these precious days for our faith in our churches, we have sought the Lord and felt his presence strongly within and among us. In the Church's faith in Jesus, risen from the dead, I wish everyone a Happy Easter, as we seek God's blessing on us all and our world in our present need.

Some thoughts for today:

Within our own community we share the greeting of HAPPY EASTER with everyone, priest and people. We also share between priest and people the words of blessing as we cannot meet for the blessing to be spoken by the priest, and given to the people in their presence and in their hearing -

MAY THE LORD BLESS US AND KEEP US FROM ALL HARM AND BRING EACH ONE OF US TO EVERLASTING LIFE. *Let us bless the lord. Amen.*

The future of our parish: where does it lie? - there is saying circulating in South Africa: *Don't say let's get back to the way things were, because the way things were has got us to where we are today.*

The people of St. Brendan's will decide the future of this parish. They will be directed in this by the degree to which the Holy Spirit is found here. We pray that the community will retain willingly its sense of belonging and that participation at Sunday Mass which is the centre and the high point of our faith practice, will remain an immediate, a valued and a fruitful encounter with God as revealed in Jesus Christ and the many families of this parish with children and young people. The Church won't fail because it is One Holy and Apostolic. The fear is that not all parishes in the Diocese will necessarily survive the economic reality to come.

The matter of priests visiting the sick and dying to administer the sacraments: instructions offered by the Apostolic Penitentiary on how to spiritually live through ser *should be remembered that perfect contrition, coming from the love of God, beloved above all things, expressed by a sincere request for forgiveness (that which the penitent is at present able to express) and accompanied by votum confessionis, that is, by the firm resolution to have recourse as soon as possible, to sacramental confession, obtains forgiveness of sins, even mortal ones (cf. CCC, no. 1452).* **Decree on the Granting of Special Indulgences to the Faithful in the Current Pandemic:** "The Church prays for those who find themselves unable to receive the Sacrament of the Sick and of the Viaticum, entrusting each and everyone to Divine Mercy by virtue of the Communion of Saints and granting the faithful a Plenary Indulgence on the point of death, provided they are duly disposed and have recited a few prayers during their lifetime (in this case the Church makes up for the three usual conditions required). For the attainment of this indulgence, the use of the crucifix or the cross is recommended."

Decree of Congregation for Divine Worship and Discipline of the Sacraments

1. The Chrism Mass wasn't celebrated on Holy Thursday morning but will be celebrated in the Cathedral at a later date - perhaps as late as August 4th - Feast of St. John Vianney.
2. We have celebrated the Paschal Triduum from Holy Thursday night to the Easter Vigil s instructed by the Conference of Bishops in Scotland. Our bishop offers support to the faithful people of this parish through his Pastoral Letter which is published opposite.
3. On Good Friday and at the Easter Vigil, an additional prayer was offered in the general intercessions for the sick, the deceased carers, etc. due to the corona virus outbreak.
4. At Easter Vigil, we did light the Easter candle and we also sang the Exultet - no fire, no procession. We blessed Easter [baptismal] water and we renewed our baptismal promises.

Some general matters to be aware of:

- We want to sustain the spiritual life of the community through online streaming of *morning Mass* each day on Facebook at 9.30 - OTHER THAN TOMORROW - Easter Monday, when Mass will be at 11AM following on from this change made last year for Easter Monday and Boxing Day. We will develop the *Talk on Scripture each day at 1pm* and move from the Passion Narratives of Holy Week to examine the history of the first Christian communities from study of the Letters of the New Testament primarily of St. Paul and the Acts of the Apostles whose author was the evangelist Luke. We will also maintain the *Time for Prayer in the church at 4.15pm* which lasts about 20 minutes and present the **Rosary at 12 noon** for the intentions of the community. All opportunities for prayer are there to be taken up live or later.
- Families can come either or both today and tomorrow to the church door from the Barons Road [chapel house] entry for the following items: Easter chocolate, Easter workbooks for children and today's bulletin which will also be available on the Parish's web site. They are all securely available there in a basket
- **Families with a relative confined to the house and anyone living alone** should note that if they wish the Sacrament of the Sick or wish a visit from Fr. Ness this can be arranged by a telephone call to the chapel house. He will be very happy to visit and to do so in line with the current health advice for all.
- **The parish's Children's Liturgy programme:** we wish to preserve what the parish and the families of the parish have formed through our Liturgy Team in the provision for our children of Primary School age. Our Twitter feed contains items for the children for today on the Scriptures and on activities to be done at home. Mrs. Debbie Ferns from P5F at the School will present the spiritual material for the children during our "Online" morning Mass today and will share the homily period of the Mass with Fr. Ness in that regard. **Sacramental Preparation for P3 and P4 children** the Sacrament of Reconciliation for the P3 children has been postponed to a date yet to be fixed. **The P4 children** preparing to receive Holy Communion for the first time won't be forgotten by the parish community **even though a new date will have to be set for this celebration.**
- **Ecumenism:** Fr. Ness and Ian Douglas of St. Margaret's have exchanged greetings and given assurances of prayers shared with and for our two Christian communities in Muirhouse **and the whole local community.**
