Dear Fathers and Deacons,

I hope this finds you well.

I have been speaking to the Deans about the forthcoming Deanery Meetings and preparations are being made for them to happen virtually in the near future. I have prepared an agenda which I attach with this letter. I pray for the Lord's blessing for us and seek Our Lady's intercession as we seek to serve the Lord and the people of our Diocese in faith, hope and charity.
